- Hauls rock, sand and gravel;
- Paints cross walks and street markings;
- Erects barricades and puts up flag markings at repair or construction sites;
- Checks and cleans storm sewer drains;
- Mows grass and trims trees;
- Cleans buildings;
- Pours and works concrete;
- Removes snow and sands icy streets;
- Operates heavy and light equipment;
- Installs and replaces street signs.

The Maintenance Worker III – Street will use heavy and light equipment in the performance of duties and may supervise seasonal personnel in the department.

Essential Functions

- Repairs streets, alleys and curbs;
- Hauls rock, sand and gravel;
- Erects barricades and puts up flag markings at repair and construction sites;
- Checks and cleans storm sewer drains;
- Removes snow and sands icy streets;
- Performs preventive maintenance on equipment and tools;
- Operates heavy and light equipment;
- Installs and replaces street signs;
- Pours, works and finishes concrete;
- Paints cross walks and street markings;
- Mows grass and trims trees; and
- Cleans buildings.

- Works with other departments;
- Other assigned duties as deemed necessary or as required.

Supervisory Responsibilities

Supervises seasonal personnel.
