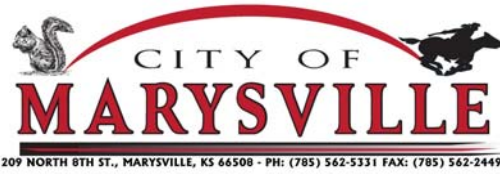

Manhole Project

The manhole project is moving along here in Marysville. They have finished with the second manhole at 7th street and have moved onto 9th street. The projected completion date for the project is Mid June. It takes approximately 2 weeks per manhole. We still have 11th and 13th street to do after 9th street.



Lagoons/Wetlands

They have started on the wetlands part of the project on the east side of the Big Blue River next to the levee road and the 5th cell for the lagoons is all but completed. The reason that this is being done is because federal regulations do not allow water systems to discharge into water ways.



New Lagoon

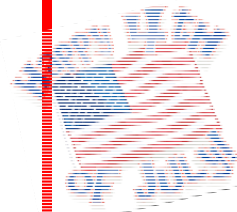


New Wetlands

They also suggested that the trees be removed and we should not allow any unauthorized vehicles on the levee because they are destructive (causing ruts). The levee is not supposed to be used for recreational purposes such as UTV's, motor cycles, horses, etc.

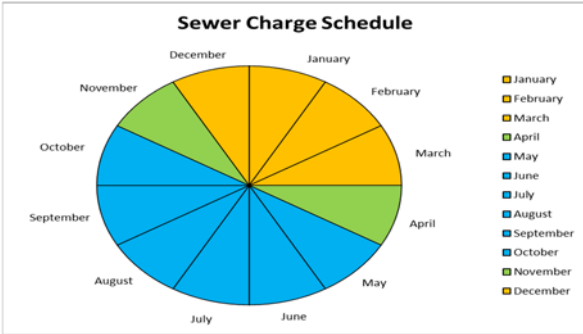
Brush Dump

Our city brush dump is open from 9 am until dark 7 days a week. We do ask that if you are using our dump to please be aware that it is for grass clippings, limbs, tree stumps, etc. We also ask that when you bring these items to the dump that you sort them and place them in the appropriate area for such items. We do not take construction products such as wood, concrete, bricks, etc. or any other household items. If you have any questions please call City Hall, Monday thru Friday at 785-562-5331. Your attention to our request is greatly appreciated and helps us be able to have it open year round without supervision.

DUE DATES FOR WATER/SEWER BILLS

For your convenience we have an after hours drop box located on the south side of the front doors at City hall. As a reminder, bills are due the 22nd of each month. If the date falls on a Saturday or Sunday, the bill is due the following Monday by 8:00 am.

Address Numbers

Does your home or business have its address number clearly visible from the street? Does your home or business have numbers at all? If you can't see your address number or need to put on numbers, the city has reflective numbers for you to put on your building for **FREE!** Just stop by City Hall and pick them up during business hours.

Having clear and visible numbers on your building is important as it helps emergency vehicles identify where they need to go. In an emergency, every second counts! Having identifiable address helps cut response time.

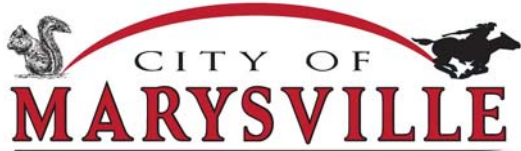

In October of 2020, the City passed City Ordinance 1893 that requires citizens to make sure that we have updated information on whose name is on your utility (water) bills. If the person whose name is on the utility bill should die or leaves permanently, the person still residing there shall establish service under their name within 30 days of that event.

In the case of a death, a spouse continuing to live at the residence shall be named as the account holder on the existing account without need for a service connection fee, however an application is required to update our records.

If the premises is inherited, rented, or sold to another party and water is wanted at that address then new paperwork must be completed for the service. We will need an application filled out, current photo ID & \$100 connection fee.

You may come into City Hall to fill out an application at 209 N 8th Street Monday through Friday, 8 am – 5 pm, we can email you a copy of the application, we can put an application in the mail to you or you can visit our website at the following link https://www.cityofmarysvilleks.com/files/ugd/485548_3538a10a2cdd4f74a61a4eecd13099f.pdf.
