ORDINANCE NO. 1873

**AN ORDINANCE ADDING A NEW SECTION 14-233, VEHICLE PARKING ON PUBLIC RIGHT OF WAY, IN CHAPTER 14, ARTICLE 2, LOCAL TRAFFIC REGULATIONS, OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF MARYSVILLE, KANSAS, 2009.**

**Be it Ordained by the Governing Body of the City of Marysville:**

**SECTION 1.** That a new Section 14-233, Vehicle Parking on Public Right of Way, in Chapter 14, Article 2, Local Traffic Regulations, of the Code of the City of Marysville, Kansas, is hereby added and shall read as follows:

**"14-233. Vehicle Parking on Public Right of Way.**

- a. No person or operator shall park any vehicle, including a motor vehicle as defined by the Standard Traffic Ordinance as adopted from time to time, on unpaved surfaces on public right of way, as such terms are defined in the Code of the City of Marysville, Kansas for over a 24 hour period, except temporarily to load or unload property, temporarily by a contractor, owner or tenant actively engaged in work on the property, or as otherwise provided for within this section. These temporary exceptions are limited to 30 days. Any time required beyond 30 days must receive approval from the city administrator or their designee.
  1. Paved surfaces include concrete, asphalt, gravel or brick.
- b. No person shall access private property or public right of way by driving any vehicle over an existing standard street curb or by utilizing a public sidewalk ramp as a means of ingress or egress, except as noted in a. above.
- c. A person convicted of a violation of this section shall pay a fine of up to \$100.00 plus court costs for the first offense within a calendar year; up to \$250.00 plus court costs for a second offense within a calendar year; and up to \$500.00 plus court costs for a third or any subsequent offense within a calendar year."

**SECTION 2.** All other ordinances or parts of other ordinances in conflict herewith are repealed. However, any section of an existing ordinance not in conflict herewith is not repealed and remains in full force and effect.

**SECTION 3.** That this ordinance shall become effective upon and after its passage, approval and publication in the official city newspaper pursuant to KSA 12-3001, et seq.
